

Course Description

The purpose of this course is to review the psychologic aspects of addiction, identify who is at risk and discuss the legal ramifications of inappropriately prescribing opioid medications. There will be a review of the new national guidelines from the CDC and the North Carolina Medical Board guidelines on opioid prescribing. This course is designed for all medical providers specifically primary care providers since studies show that they prescribe roughly 50% of all opioid prescriptions.

Target Audience

Primary Care Practitioners (Family Practice, Internal Medicine), Adolescent Medicine Providers, Gynecologists, Occupational Medicine Practitioners, Dentist, Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Practitioners, Psychiatrists, Psychologists, Anesthesiology Pain Management Practitioners, Pharmacists, PAs, RNs, NPs, Residents, Dental Hygienist, Students and Other Healthcare Providers in primary health care settings or with an interest in pain management.

Learning Objectives

At the conclusion of this knowledge-based activity, participants should be able to:

- ◆ Review decision-making strategies to consider when prescribing opioid, non-opioid pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic strategies for management of chronic pain.
- ◆ Promote appropriate and safe opioid usage in patients by examining risks factors associated with initiation or maintenance.
- ◆ Identify addiction-risk patients on opioid therapy and employ key diagnostic and treatment techniques including genetics for the management of pain.
- ◆ Describe key diagnostic and treatment techniques, including genetics for the management of pain in patients at risk for opioid addiction
- ◆ Discuss the importance of psychological evaluation and treatment for patient being evaluated for chronic opioid management.
- ◆ Review the current State and National guidelines regarding opioid prescribing
- ◆ Recognize the legal ramifications of improper opioid prescribing
