Providers will gain understanding of the importance of utilizing the Controlled Substance Reporting System (CSRS) and evaluating for substance abuse and misuse in primary care and specialty practices through the use of the Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) tool.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this program, the participant should be able to:

1. Describe recent trends of local and national drug use and misuse allowing prescribers to make educated decisions when prescribing related to social effects of prescribed medications and allowing law enforcement to recognize in the community.
2. State recommendations from the ACP Prescription Drug Abuse Policy Position Statement and the NCMB Policy for the Use of Opiates for the Treatment of Pain to help prevent or delay the onset of opioid use and/or prevent the progression of high-risk or problematic use.
3. Describe rational prescribing practices according to the ACP and NCMB Policies that help ensure adequate pain management while minimizing the risk of abuse of controlled medications.
4. Register prescribers for the North Carolina Controlled Substance Reporting System.
5. Demonstrate and teach the use of Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral and Treatment (SBIRT) in clinical practice settings.
